1. Youth Specialist 1:

May be providing support to children with significant mental health and/or behavioral needs. Promoting growth and independence with personal needs and ADLs, implementing behavioral support plans, monitoring health and safety, building advocacy, decision making and community connections, and completion of required documentation.

As an YS1, you would:

- Implement goals, as written within the individual's plan
- Assist/Support the child with daily living skills (bathing, dressing, toileting as needed)
- Promote independence in various areas of life including behavior, self-regulation, building relationships, socialization and health/safety.
- Transporting and accompanying children to activities of their choice
- Implement safeguards per the individualized plan
- Obtain/maintain CPR/FA certification and other necessary trainings/certifications
- Utilize a pro-active approach to any/all crisis or de-escalation situations
- Complete required service documentation within a timely-manner
- Collaborate within a team, including the family, child and other program staff
- Participate in agency-wife events, advocacy and/or community educating

Required Education/Experience:

High school diploma/GED required. Prior experience working with children with DD/ABI and/or a mental health diagnosis or behavioral needs is preferred. Good written/verbal communication is required as well as demonstrating teamwork and professionalism. Basic word processing and e-mail skills required.

A Master's degree in social work, counseling, psychology or a related human services field and one year of related experience with Children's mental health, substance abuse, and/or foster care, **OR** a Master's Degree in social work, counseling, psychology or a related human services field and certification in an Evidence Based Practice, **OR** a Bachelor degree with certification in an evidence-based practice consistent with the CPST component being delivered. 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3. Program Therapist OLP

Responsibilities

The **OLP Behavioral Specialist** provides OLP (Other Licensed Professional) clinical/behavioral health services to program participants in nontraditional settings such as home and/or community or other site-based settings within their scope of practice to effectively engage children, youth and families/caregivers who may have difficulty engaging in traditional clinic based settings.

Qualifications

Master's degree with up to two (2) years of experience in providing therapeutic mental and behavioral health counseling to children and families is required. Working knowledge of child development. Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT), or Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) credential is required or Licensed Master Social Worker when under the supervision of an LCSW. Successful completion of the required credentialing process including criminal background check, and State Central Registry clearance. Strong verbal and written communication skills, organizational skills, knowledge of best practices working with children and families, and demonstrated ability to work with people from diverse cultures and backgrounds
