Crisis respite and stabilization would be particularly beneficial to youth as an alternative to utilization of hospital emergency departments or inpatient hospitalization. The LGU will advocate for flexible crisis respite and stabilization opportunities to be added to the Orange County System of Care that can be accessed regardless of system the individual is connected to (EX: OMH, OPWDD, OCFS).

The appropriate level of care to meet the individuals' assessed needs, regardless of the "primary" system the individuals in connected to will be available, thus preventing individuals from extended stays in emergency departments or discharges to levels of care that cannot provide the supports they need.

Clear, consistent criteria will help ensure that individuals' needs are met; and families, providers and law enforcement will have a better understanding of the decisions being made, leading to better collaboration. Advocacy will occur during quarterly LGU meetings with local 9.39 hospitals, the WELCOME Orange Combined Provider Meeting, Complexity Support Planning Meetings, the Orange County Crisis Services Continuum meetings, and during meetings with the State Offices. The LGU will also advocate for access to the right level of care at the time that individuals need it.

The Department of Social Services (DSS)/Behavioral Health Lean Project strives to improve communication and understanding between DSS, behavioral health providers, and the Court System in order to achieve permanency faster for children in care. Therefore, in 2024 the LGU, in collaboration with DSS, will educate providers on the DSS/Behavioral Health Lean Project and encourage providers to increase the percentage of monthly reports returned to DSS on time, in turn improving the time to permanency for youth in Foster Care.

1 The OMH/DOH guidance provided to inpatient and outpatient providers about the expectations for admission, discharge, and continuity of care have been helpful. OCDMH will continue to work with the state and local providers towards meeting the expectations laid out in the guidance documents in order to better serve individuals. OCDMH will share information on guidance and changes to regulations with inpatient and outpatient providers as available and support implementation efforts. 2 OCDMH completed the RFP process outlined in this objective. One program funded to improve transitions of care was a pilot project to pair peer supports with an EMS provider to co-respond to individuals who experience a non-fatal overdose. The peer support workers will be able to engage with the individual and encourage connection to needed resources. OCDMH will also continue to support inpatient and outpatient providers in actualizing the OMH/DOH guidance around discharge planning 3 Orange County is actively working to increase the systems' capacity to support the 0-5 population. This will be done through partnership with the Orange County Health Department, community providers, and the Orange County Training Institute.

4 OCDMH will work with local hospitals and outpatient providers to identify individuals who may be eligible for Assisted Outpatient Treatment and support providers in complying with AOT regulations and guidance in order to meet the needs of the individuals being served.
